	Criteria.	Marks	Attributes of exhibit
	Introductory statement		
1.	Treatment	15	Material strictly relevant to title and plan.
	Importance	10	Good coverage gauged by its relationship to the study of the chosen subject, and without major gaps.
2.	Knowledge of Subject	20	Accurate appreciation of subject and key facts logical and readily apparent.
	Philatelic Knowledge	10	In depth study of existing information.
	Personal Research	5	Presentation of new information. New way to develop subject.
3.	Condition: Stamps & Postmarks	10	Mint stamps: as near perfect as possible. Used stamps: lightly cancelled and consistent quality, but as appropriate for typical usage. No filing creases through stamps. Postmarks/covers: clean, clear legible strikes.
	Rarity	10	Presence of known rare/scarce items. Scarcity in terms of availability and importance.
4.	Presentation	10	General appearance: neat, tidy and easy to follow development.
		10	Arrangement: accurate writing up sheets, neither over-crowded nor under-crowded.

1.	Treatment	20	Plan of collection: Presence of and Accuracy of plan page, and consistency with title. Correct, logical and balanced division into parts. Coverage of all parts to plan. Good coverage gauged by its relationship to the study of the chosen subject, and without major gaps.
2.	Development of Theme	10	Originality: Depth of Study to develop theme in original way.
		10	Completeness: Depth & balance of analysis of each part.
		10	Thematic Knowledge: thorough knowledge of chosen theme and philately to identify material displayed.
3.	Philatelic Knowledge	10	Variety of material of different types: presence of different types of philatelic material and postal characteristics.
		10	Philatelic Information: valid philatelic study in line with the theme and plan.
4.	Condition and Rarity	10	Condition: Preferably mint stamps, clean, tidy covers or pieces with legible cancellations.
		5	Rarity: Scarcity in terms of availability and relevance to theme.
5.	Presentation	8	General appearance: Neat, tidy and easy to follow theme.
		7	Arrangement: Accurate writing up and mounting, logical sequence of all material.
